68/17 – CRISIS SITUATION – PROCEDURES

1. Any crisis situation related to Pacific Region cadet activities that involve cadets, COATS members, CIs, and/or volunteers shall be reported to the Regional Cadet Support Unit (Pacific) as soon as possible.
2. After engaging local emergency services as required, Corps/Squadron Commanding Officers are to contact their J3 Zone Training Officer with an initial report of the situation. Should the J3 Zone Training Officer not be available, the applicable J3 Area OIC shall be contacted. In the event that neither the J3 Zone Training Officer or the J3 Area OIC is available, the J35 Chief Training Officer, LCol Head, is to be contacted at 250-508-7572.

69/17 – CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF OPERATION HONOUR STATEMENT

1. Today we released our third report detailing the progress made so far with [Operation HONOUR](#). There are a number of measures we have undertaken since the last progress report in November. Some of them include:
 - a. of the reported cases of harmful sexual behaviour, more than 40 percent are being reported by third parties, which is an indication our Bystander Intervention Training is working. I want everyone in our institution to be a trained bystander and speak up if they see something wrong;
 - b. there are now six Sexual Offence Response Teams staffed by members of the Canadian Forces National Investigation Service. Their specialized training focuses on investigation, interview techniques and victim confidentiality to ensure Military Police are highly-trained in sexual assault investigations;
 - c. the Military Police have identified 166 unfounded sexual assault cases since 2010 and are reviewing all of them to ensure they were handled properly;
 - d. the Military Police are also in the process of developing a system based on the Philadelphia Model that invites victims and advocates to regularly review police case files to maintain strong accountability;
 - e. since January, we have issued 77 notices of intent to release to illustrate there are consequences for those who choose to engage in harmful sexual behaviour.
2. The success of Operation HONOUR is intrinsically linked to that of the Canadian Armed Forces. Harmful sexual behaviour seriously affects the operational effectiveness of our institution and cannot be tolerated from anyone. Moving forward, we will continue to rely on stakeholders, empirical evidence and ongoing leadership engagement to guide our approach and make modifications to our plan as appropriate.
3. We still have a long way to go, but we're making progress. I am personally committed to ensuring we keep welcoming more women into our ranks, engaging with survivors, increasing diversity and providing better services and support for our people. By facilitating a culture of respect and dignity for all, we will continue to be a proud, honourable and operationally effective force for Canada.

73/17 – POSITIVE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND PROGRAM OUTREACH

Ref: 4500-3 (J5 Pers Trg Plans) 8 Mar 17

1. Ref memorandum was distributed to all corps and squadrons and the direction from the DComd Natl CJCR Sp Gp, Col J.G.D. Proteau, is summarized for emphasis below:

- a. there is a requirement for Canadian Cadet Organizations (CCO) adult leaders to complete the Positive Youth Development and Program Outreach (PYDPO) learning package;
- b. the PYDPO package is now a pre-requisite for members to attend any CIC Occupational, Job-Based or Specialty Training as well as to be employed at Cadet Training Centres (CTCs) / Regional Training Establishments (RTEs). Corps / squadron and RCSU personnel must ensure that members have completed the PYDPO prior to being nominated for training and/or employment. New enrollees are authorized to be nominated on the CIC Basic Officer Training Course (BOTC) Distance Learning (DL) phase and the CIC Occupational Training Course (OTC) DL phase, but will be required to complete the PYDPO prior to being nominated for the BOTC in-house phase;
- c. administrative actions shall be taken for any Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) member within the CCO who has failed to complete the PYDPO package within 6 months after the date they have been enrolled;
- d. CAF members who transfer to the Cadet Organizations Administration and Training Service (COATS) are required to complete the PYDPO prior to the completion of the transfer process;
- e. civilian instructors and civilian employees must complete this mandatory training requirement within 6 months of the date they joined the organization. Failure to do so will entail the imposition of administrative actions which may lead to their involvement / employment being terminated. Civilian instructors and civilian employees will not receive pay for the completion of the PYDPO package;
- f. COATS members who joined the organization after 1 Jan 17 will receive pay for the completion of the PYDPO package. Based on a course review and updated courseware, COATS members are entitled to receive up to 2 days of Class A pay upon completion of the package. No pay entitlement exists for members who have been enrolled prior to this date; and
- g. Col Proteau orders that cadet corps/squadron Commanding Officers and Officers in Charge (OIC) of cadet / CIC RTEs to validate that their respective subordinates have completed this mandatory requirement.

1. COATS members will no longer receive T4s by mail delivery.

2. Effective for the 2015 tax year (and future tax years), the expectation was that the majority of CAF personnel would have access to their T4 from their Employee Member Access Application (EMAA) account, or have the T4 slip delivered electronically to an email address specified in EMAA.

3. For members without access to EMAA through a DWAN work station, the process for obtaining an EMAA account is:

- a. fill in the DND 4121-E, Waiver for the Employee Member Access Application (EMAA) available in the file repository, to have the T4 delivered to an email address of your choice (work or home);
- b. email or fax the completed waiver to Human Resources Information Centre (HRIC). Contact information can be found at the bottom of the waiver form. If you do not have access to a scanner or fax, the waiver form can be mailed to:

To date, several individuals have reported having not received the 2016 T4 Slip. All individuals who have reported missing their T4 have had their name submitted to Ottawa in order to obtain a reprint. Reprints are being electronically distributed to this HQ and will be distributed electronically from the Chief Clerk to the applicable individual as soon as possible.

6. If you have not yet received your 2016 T4, you must contact the Chief Clerk, preferably by email, so a reprint may be ordered. The turnaround is approximately one week.

78/17 – PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS

GENERAL

1. The general voting day for the next British Columbia provincial General Election will be on Tuesday, 9 May 2017, from 0800 hrs to 2000 hrs (Pacific time). Notwithstanding an individual's right to form personal political affiliations and to make personal political choices, all military members of the Pacific Region Cadet Program are reminded that there are regulations in place that govern their active participation in or support to political activities while on duty.
2. Requests for support in relation to the upcoming election are to be treated as sensitive matters and they shall, in all cases, be referred immediately to RCSU (Pac).

POLITICAL ACTIVITIES AT DND AND CADET PROGRAM FACILITIES

3. In accordance with existing regulations all personnel are reminded that any activity that takes place on a Defence Establishment, a Base, or other facility under the control of Pacific Region Cadets shall not affect the actual or perceived neutrality of the Canadian Armed Forces. Therefore:
 - a. political meetings shall not be held and political speeches shall not be delivered in or at any facility used to support the Cadet Program. If the owner of a facility used to support the Cadet Program chooses to allow political meetings or political speeches to take place within the facility, all Cadet Program signage shall be covered or removed;
 - b. cadet activities shall not be scheduled for the same time that a facility owner has scheduled a political activity; and
 - c. political advertising shall not be posted in facilities used to support the Cadet Program. Where the facility is shared with other organizations, political advertising shall not be posted in that portion dedicated to supporting the Cadet Program.

INDIVIDUAL INVOLVEMENT IN POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

4. General. CAF members are bound by existing regulations concerning political activity, which prohibit in particular their active participation in the affairs of a political organization or party.
5. Regular Force. No member of the Regular Force shall:
 - a. take an active part in the affairs of a political organization or party;
 - b. make a political speech to electors, announce himself, or allow himself to be announced as a candidate, or prospective candidate, for election to the provincial legislature;
 - c. except with the permission of the Chief of the Defence Staff, accept an office in a municipal corporation or other local government body or allow himself to be nominated for election to such office; or
 - d. work for a candidate on his own time. Working in civilian clothes, at home, stuffing envelopes, or doing other menial tasks is covered by this prohibition. This type of low-level activity constitutes an active part in the affairs of a political organization or party. It therefore falls under the general prohibition contained in QR&Os. CF members, who may be members of political parties, are restricted to a purely passive role, largely only receiving political information, whether or not it's on their own time, in civilian clothes, in their own residences, and so forth.
6. Reserve Force. Members of the Reserve Force, including COATS, shall not actively support or participate in any political activity while on duty or while in uniform.

CADET INVOLVEMENT IN POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

7. Cadets shall not be used to support any political activity. In particular they shall not be used to distribute handouts or flyers in support of any political activity.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS GUIDANCE

8. During a provincial election period, the strict considerations and restrictions embodied in the Election Act do not apply. However, to ensure that there will not be any perception of bias, all communications with Canadians, including announcements, public consultations, advertising, news releases, backgrounders, media advisories, consultations, outreach activities, and articles for external publication shall be staffed through the chain of command to RCSU (Pac) for approval prior to release.

79/17 – PHOTO ID REQUIRED FOR AIR TRAVEL

1. All Corps and Squadron Commanding Officers are to ensure that all cadets and staff are in possession of one piece of government issued picture identification. This identification is required for all modes of transportation to and from the CTC including parent drop off.

2. It is the responsibility of the Corps/Squadron COs to ensure that cadets being sent on DND arranged transportation are in possession of the correct types of valid government issued photo ID.

3. All fees associated with acquiring government issued photo ID for cadets are the responsibility of the parents/guardians of the cadets.

4. Valid government photo ID include: driver's license, passport, status card, or a provincial identity card.

5. The following are not considered to be valid government photo ID: school IDs, bus passes or other forms of public transportation passes, or photocopies of any form of government ID.

6. Corps/squadron COs shall ensure that this information is passed to all cadets, all staff, their sponsor/parent committees, and the parents/guardians of all cadets.

7. The cadet's name in FORTRESS shall be the same name that appears on the government issued photo ID.

80/17 – TRANSPORTATION WHILE ON CORPS/SQUADRON EXERCISES

1. Corps/Squadron COs are reminded that authority to order, cancel, or change transportation is to be coordinated through the RCSU (Pac) Movements Section. During regular working hours (0800 hrs – 1600 hrs), the appropriate J3 Training Support Coordinator is to be contacted.

2. For urgent transportation requirements during the weekends, contact the Duty Movements Officer at 1-866-668-8388. The Movements Section's common email cannot be monitored after working hours or on weekends.

3. Corps/Squadron COs and staff can check the status of their buses and u-drive vehicles(s) in the monthly transportation sheets posted in the Movements Requirements and Requests folder in the File Repository. If you see an entry, the bus or vehicle has been ordered. Corps/Squadron staff are responsible to check and confirm all information a minimum of three days prior to travel and not during the day of travel.

4. Toll Charges – if you are required to cross a Toll Bridge during your exercise and you receive a bill from the rental agency, please forward the bill to RCSU (Pac) Movements Section.

81/17 – VEHICLE RENTAL – FUEL CHARGES

Ref: Canadian Forces Temporary Duty Travel Instructions (CFTDTI)

1. All personnel are reminded that when picking up and returning rental vehicles the following process shall be followed:
 - a. on picking up the rental vehicle, ensure the fuel tank is at least $\frac{1}{4}$ full. You will return it the same way. These are the terms in all SOAs; and
 - b. if the rental agency offers to charge for a tank of gas on return of the vehicle, members shall not accept this offer. Rental agencies will not provide a refund for any fuel that remains at the time of drop-off which is why you try to have the same amount in the tank when you return the vehicle.
2. Failure to follow the above procedure could result in the member having to pay all fuel charges that are determined to be either inappropriate or excessive.
3. All DND/RCSU (Pac) vehicles can be fuelled at MSE or Dockyard. MSE fuel pumps are on your right after entering the gate at the back of the building. Dockyard fuel pumps are located by entering Naden gates, turn left at T, turn right at Fleet School, proceed through Commissionaire gate, follow road through transport area, pumps are on your right. Any questions may be directed to the Movements Section at 1-866-668-8388.

82/17 – SEA SERVICE INSIGNIA – NAVAL DEU

1. For those members wearing the Navy DEU, please note that the SSI is to be removed from your tunic prior to the Battle of the Atlantic 7 May 17.
2. As directed at last fall's Naval Board, discussed at the Naval Dress Committee meeting and approved secretarially by the National Dress Committee, the cloth SSI on the Naval DEU tunic is to be replaced by the metal SSI. The change is to take place in time for the Battle of Atlantic ceremony 7 May 17.
3. You may notice a slight discoloration around the contour of the cloth SSI once you remove it. It can be easily fixed by using a bit of steam, and once the tunic is dry-cleaned it is no longer noticeable. The metal SSI is to be positioned in the same location as the cloth one on the upper right breast of the tunic.
4. This does not apply to those with SSI on the CA and RCAF DEU.
5. The cloth SSI can be reused and placed on the NCD jacket as per previous direction.

83/17 – DRESS FOR CORPS AND SQUADRON STAFF

1. It is my expectation that the dress for our Corps and Squadron Officers be in line with the order of dress our cadets are directed to wear on any occasion. Many corps/squadrons are directing cadets into Parade Dress, and then in turn show up wearing CADPAT – this is unacceptable and must stop. We lead by example and if we are telling cadets to wear their dress uniforms, we are to put the same level of effort into our own appearance.
2. Many Air Force Officers are wearing the wedge with CADPAT. This is in direct contravention of the Canadian Forces Dress Instructions which states that Air Force personnel shall wear the following headdress:
 - a. ceremonial dress – wedge cap, tuque, Yukon cap, or turban;
 - b. service dress – as above and beret; and

c. operational dress:

- (1) flying clothing – wedge cap, beret, tuque, or turban; and
- (2) CADPAT – beret, tuque, or turban.

3. The practice of wearing the wedge with CADPAT is to cease immediately. This also speaks to leading by example and showing the cadets what “right looks like”.

86/17 – WEARING OF HELMETS WHILE SAILING FOR SEA CADETS

Ref: CANCDTGEN 004/17 DComd Natl CJCR Sp Gp 18 Apr 17

1. Research is currently underway to determine the nature of head injuries sustained by cadets while sailing and recommendations on how to prevent them. Once complete, a Concussion Prevention/Management Strategy/Policy will be released.

2. To assist in the mitigation of head injuries and until the final Concussion Prevention / Management Strategy / Policy is promulgated, the following direction will be implemented upon receipt:

- a. Cadets who are learning to sail or who have not obtained Sail Canada CANSail Level 1 shall wear a helmet;
- b. Cadets who wore a helmet at the end of the sailing season in 2016 shall continue to wear a helmet for sailing season 2017 and beyond, regardless of Sail Canada CANSail Level; and
- c. Cadets who have obtained Sail Canada CANSail Level 1 and did not wear a helmet at the end of sailing season 2016 are not required to wear a helmet for sailing season 2017.

3. The Cadet Program is designed to provide fun and challenging activities for our youth to engage in. The safety of all participants is the most paramount driver in all our undertakings and where we can mitigate the risks we will take appropriate action.
